Fundraising

All students are expected to be involved in fundraising so that we have funds for special celebrations and money to take trips. Fundraising money is used to support all students in the band at every level. Information regarding fundraisers will be announced in school, posted on sapphire, and posted on the webpage. Please consider participating and building the funds for our group.

Any other concerts or performance will be announced as soon as possible.

All Students are required to attend the concert.

We work together as a team in rehearsals to perform as a team in the concert. We can only sound our best if we have everyone present.

The only excuses accepted for missing a concert are severe illness, extreme emergency in the family, or death of a family member. A makeup assignment will then be given in place of the concert.

Concert Dress

4th Grade- 6th Grade Students

Any nice dress clothing. Please consider school dress code and how you play your instrument when choosing your outfit.

7th Grade- 12th Grade Students

Concert Black. All articles of clothing that you are wearing <u>are solid black</u>. Acceptable concert black includes the following: black button-down shirt, black dress pants, black skirt, black dress, black socks, and black shoes. Please avoid colored shirts, colored ties, and colored socks.

No t-shirts, jeans, or sneaker! We want to look as professional as we sound!

If purchasing these items will put a financial burden on your family, please contact Ms. Rhodes or Mr. Czekaj. We are more than willing to help in any way that we can.

Supplies Needed

Beginning Band Supplies

In order to get the most out of your band experience you will need to obtain the following items. These items will help make you more successful in the long run.

Our local music store, Robert M. Sides, will have a representative at Warrior Run Middle School for an information meeting on Tuesday, September 14th, 2020 at 6:30pm to answer all of your questions.

Please make sure you have the following items as soon as possible:

- Traditions of Excellence Band Method Book: Level 1 (for your instrument)
- Any accessories for your instrument. See the chart below for what you should purchase. Robert M. Sides will provide many of these items for you if you are renting an instrument.

| Flute | Cleaning rod, cleaning swab |

| Oboe | Cork grease, cleaning swab, at least 2 reeds |
| Clarinet | Cork grease, cleaning swab, box of size 2.5 reeds (no rico please) |
| Bassoon | Cleaning swab, at least 2 reeds |
| Saxophone | Cork grease, box of size 2.5 reeds (no rico please) |
| Horn | Valve Oil- recommended Al Cass, Blue Juice |
| Trumpet | Valve Oil |
| Trombone | Slide Treatment (Super Slick Rapid Comfort) |
| Baritone | Valve Oil |
| Tuba | Valve Oil |
| Percussion | Vic Firth Sticks (size A5), Hard Plastic Mallets |

All other students, grades 5-12, are expected to have the same materials as listed in the chart above. Other materials may be added at the discretion of your lesson teacher.

Upgrading or Switching Your Instrument

Please initiate a conversation with your lesson teacher about both topics.

<u>Upgrading</u>: We want to make sure you are playing a quality instrument that will suit your needs and future needs as a musician.

Switching: Requests to switch instrument will be discussed **prior** to the switch between student, parent, and teacher, ensuring thorough consideration and a positive outlook.

^{**}Music is a joy that every child should experience. Be sure to talk to a director about your options to rent, purchase, and borrow.

Lessons & Lesson Attendance

Attendance at all lessons and rehearsals is paramount to your success as a musician!

Lessons will be taught by the following teachers:

Ms. Rhodes- 4 Brass, 5 Brass, 6 Brass, 7-8 Brass & Percussion, All High School

Mr. Czekaj- 4 Winds & Percussion, 5 Winds & Percussion, 6 Winds & Percussion, 7-8 Winds

Lessons occur during the school day on a rotating basis. A schedule will be provided to all students at least a week prior to a marking period switch. These schedules will span the length of a whole marking period. Lesson schedules will be available on the website under the MS Bands page (link found on pg. 2). Lessons are also read on the announcements every day. Lesson groups will always meet on the same day of the week.

Students are expected to attend 8 lessons during a marking period. Each student gets 1 "miss a lesson for free" pass per marking period.

If it is determined by the core subject teacher that the day's content cannot be missed, students may remain in class and must schedule a makeup lesson.

Students must have the following materials present at all lessons:

- Instrument
- Folder with method book and music
- Pencil

If the instrument is missing at the lesson, the students will be sent back to class and will need to schedule a makeup lesson.

If a student is absent on the day of their lesson, they will be excused from that lesson.

Grading for lessons is explained on page 7.

Alternate Makeup Lesson

this option is available for High School students only

In the event that you cannot attend a makeup lesson during a marking period, you may complete an alternate makeup lesson. You are only allowed <u>1 alternate makeup per marking period</u> as the most beneficial lesson is one with Ms. Rhodes.

In order to complete an alternate makeup lesson, students will do the following

- Request an alternate makeup from Ms. Rhodes, she will then provide you with a form
- 30 minutes of focused practice on assigned material
- A video recording of an assignment as determined by your lesson teacher
- A turned in parent sign-off

Practicing

You go to your sports practices so that you can build your strength and build your muscle memory and you have so much fun with you finally get to play a game where you don't have to think about the details, but instead are focusing on heart, energy, and playing the game! Practicing your instrument regularly does the same exact thing! Playing a musical instrument will also teach you important life lessons such as dedication, perseverance, and give you a great sense of accomplishment.

Practicing a minimum of 25 minutes per day will have you seeing great results and we guarantee that you will enjoy playing your instrument so much more.

<u>Keep in mind</u>: If you practice you get better. If you get better you play with better players. If you play with better players you play better music. If you play better music you have more fun. If you have more fun you practice more. If you practice more you get better.

Rehearsal Attendance & Expectations

Band rehearsals for each ensemble occur on the following days/ periods:

- 7th/8th Grade Band: AE on even days
- 6th Grade Band: Period 9 on days 1, 3, & 5
- 5th Grade Band: Period 9 on days 2, 4, & 6
- 4th Grade Band: Tuesdays from 1:00-1:30pm, and Fridays from 8:50-9:20am
- HS Band: Period 6

All students are expected to have their instrument and their music at all rehearsals. Grading for rehearsals is explained on page 7.

Students are expected to attend all rehearsals.

If students have work to make up, we encourage them to speak to their teacher and see if there is an alternate time when they can make up the work. If there is no other time available, then they will be excused from that rehearsal. <u>However</u>, <u>students</u> will not be permitted to leave rehearsals two weeks before a concert.

Students are expected to:

- Come to rehearsal and sit down quietly
- Have all materials at all rehearsals
- Promote a focused atmosphere by removing all distractions before entering the room
- Follow directions the first time
- Listen when someone else is talking, singing, or playing
- Respect yourself, others, and your materials
- Always try your best

Remember we need to all rehearse together to have great success! There is no way to replace a rehearsal or create that experience of playing together as a group.

Discipline Plan

Should the Rehearsal Expectations (see page 7) not be met or a student is causing disruptions, the following steps will be taken:

- 1. A warning will be given to the student from the director
- 2. A consequence will be given to the student from the director
- 3. The director will **contact the parent/guardian** regarding the behavior
- 4. The student will be **referred to administration** for disciplinary action

Exiting Band

In the instance that a student finds that band is just not for them we have a procedure for exiting the band program. (But you're going to have a blast so why would you quit?!)

First, students may only leave the band program at three times during the year:

- Within the first 3 weeks of the school year
- Within the first 3 weeks after the second marking period
- At the end of the school year

We have this in place because as a member of the band you are working together for one common goal: beautiful music! If you choose to exit band in the middle of a marking period you are letting the others in the group down. We need you to fulfill your commitment to the band and help us make beautiful music.

In order to exit the program, the following steps must be completed:

- 1. A note from a parent or guardian must be turned in to the director explaining the reasoning for exiting the program
- 2. The student must have an exit interview with the director to give feedback on things they enjoyed and things they did not enjoy about band
- 3. Students must return all school district materials to the director. Examples: instruments, books, mouthpieces, sticks, mallets, etc.

Once you have completed all of these steps you will be removed from the class. Keep in mind that if you find that you wish to rejoin band you are always welcome.

^{*}Extreme circumstances may result in swifter disciplinary action. If deemed necessary, the student may be removed from the ensemble/course at the discretion of the directors and/or administration.

Grading

For grades 5-12 only. Grading for band is broken down in the following way:

| Performance | 20% |

Performances

Students will participate in 2 concerts per year: one in the winter and one in the spring.

All students are required to attend the concert. The only excuses accepted for missing a concert are severe illness, extreme emergency in the family, or death of a family member.

Rehearsal Preparedness/ Participation

Students are expected to attend all rehearsals and to be prepared with their instrument, all accessories, and their folders. Students should follow all expectations listed under "Rehearsal Attendance & Expectations" on page 7. Points will be deducted from this grade for the following reasons: missing instrument, missing music, or students is disruptive during rehearsal. One point will be deducted per missing item. This grade may not be made up

Small Group Lessons

Students are expected to attend 8 total lessons during a 9-week marking period. Each student will have one 'miss a lesson for free' pass that they can use to miss one lesson during the period. High school students may complete one "alternate lesson" in lieu of one makeup lesson per quarter. Students are expected to have their instrument, music, and pencil at all lessons. If a student does not have their instrument they will be sent back to class and will need to schedule a makeup lesson with their lesson teacher. If a student is absent on the day of their lesson they will be excused from that lesson.

Playing Tests

Students will be given playing tests selected from the following: scales, exercises from their lesson book, and band music. These tests will always be announced and students will have time to practice before assessment.

Creative Projects

Students will be given creative assignments such as researching a famous performer or creating their own melody on their instrument. We want to encourage the students to explore their instruments and to have fun and make music!

These projects will always be announced and will be due as determined by the lesson teacher.
